
## HIGHLIGHTS ARL ACADEMIC LAW LIBRARY STATISTICS 2007–2008

- Out of 113 ARL university libraries, 74 responded to this survey.<sup>1</sup>
- Law libraries reported median values of 345,935 volumes held and 8,033 gross volumes added. Also, these libraries employed the full-time equivalent of 2,129 staff members in the fiscal year 2007–2008.
- Responding libraries reported total expenditures of \$215,630,657.<sup>2</sup> As seen in the graph below, materials expenditures made up the largest portion of the total, with 47% of aggregated expenses falling under a materials-related category.
- Law libraries reported a total of \$20,345,053 on electronic materials, or a median of 22% of their total materials budgets. This includes a total of \$17,200,532 on electronic serials.

Colorado completed this survey but did not include a law library in the ARL Statistics. Rutgers has two administratively independent Law libraries, which respond separately to this survey; they are aggregated together in the ARL Statistics.
